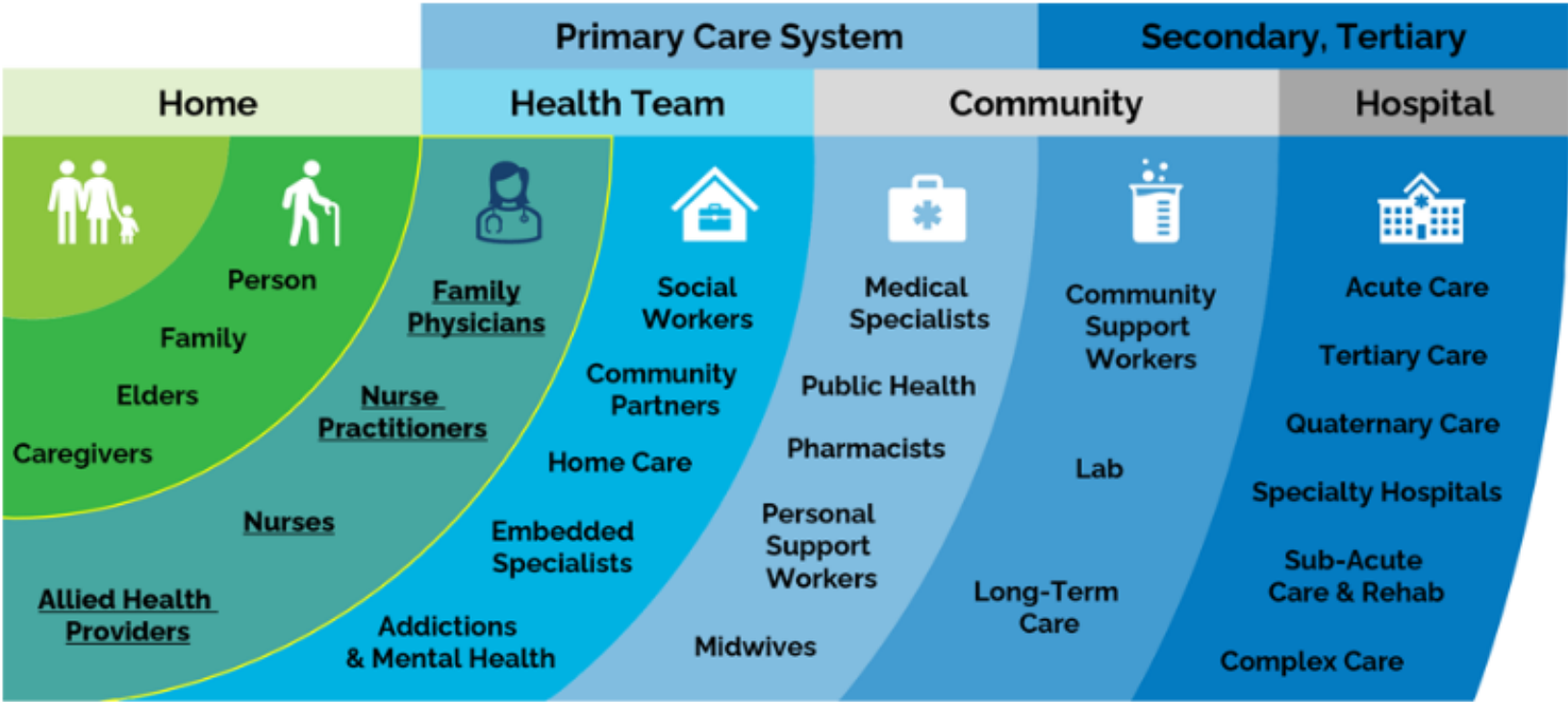

Primary Care Action Plan

January 2025

Connecting every person in Ontario to primary care

Mandate: 100% of people in Ontario are attached to a family doctor or a primary care nurse practitioner working in a publicly funded team, where they receive ongoing, comprehensive, and convenient care.

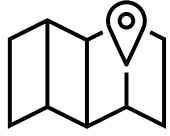


IPCT Call for Proposals

April 10, 2025

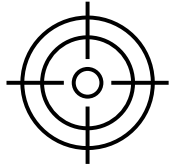
ROUND 1

- **\$213M** announced and **first call for proposals** to create and expand up to **80 primary care teams, connecting 300,000** more people to care
- **Targeted (vs. open) call:** 125 high priority communities identified, by forward sortation area (FSA) (first three digits of postal code)
 - **Three FSAs attributed to OWFR OHT: K0A, K2J, K2G**
- OHTs can submit **one (1) proposal per FSA** (3 in total for OWFR OHT)
- **Proposal are due May 2nd 5pm** to the Ministry by (very short timeline)
- Primary care providers and partners who provide care to people living in these FSAs are eligible to submit proposals for consideration through Ottawa West Four Rivers OHT
- Province selects and announces successful teams: Summer 2025
- Province to launch second call for proposals: September 2025



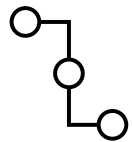
GEOGRAPHIC PRIMARY CARE ATTACHMENT

New and expanded IPCTs will work toward ongoing attachment of 100% of people within identified postal codes to a regular family physician, physician group, or primary care nurse practitioner. This included attaching people on the Health Care Connect referral list.



TARGETED DATA-DRIVEN ROLL OUT

There will be multiple rounds of intake and assessment to allocated multi-year investment. The first round is targeted to communities with the highest number of people not attached to primary care.



ROLE OF ONTARIO HEALTH TEAMS (OHTs)

OHTs and their Primary Care Networks (PCNs) will support clinicians to develop and coordinate submission of proposals for new and expanded IPCTs. While collaboration is encouraged, OHT support for Indigenous-led proposals is not required.

Include use of **Health Care Connect** list

Priority to highest **proportion** of attachment

Operational by summer 2025

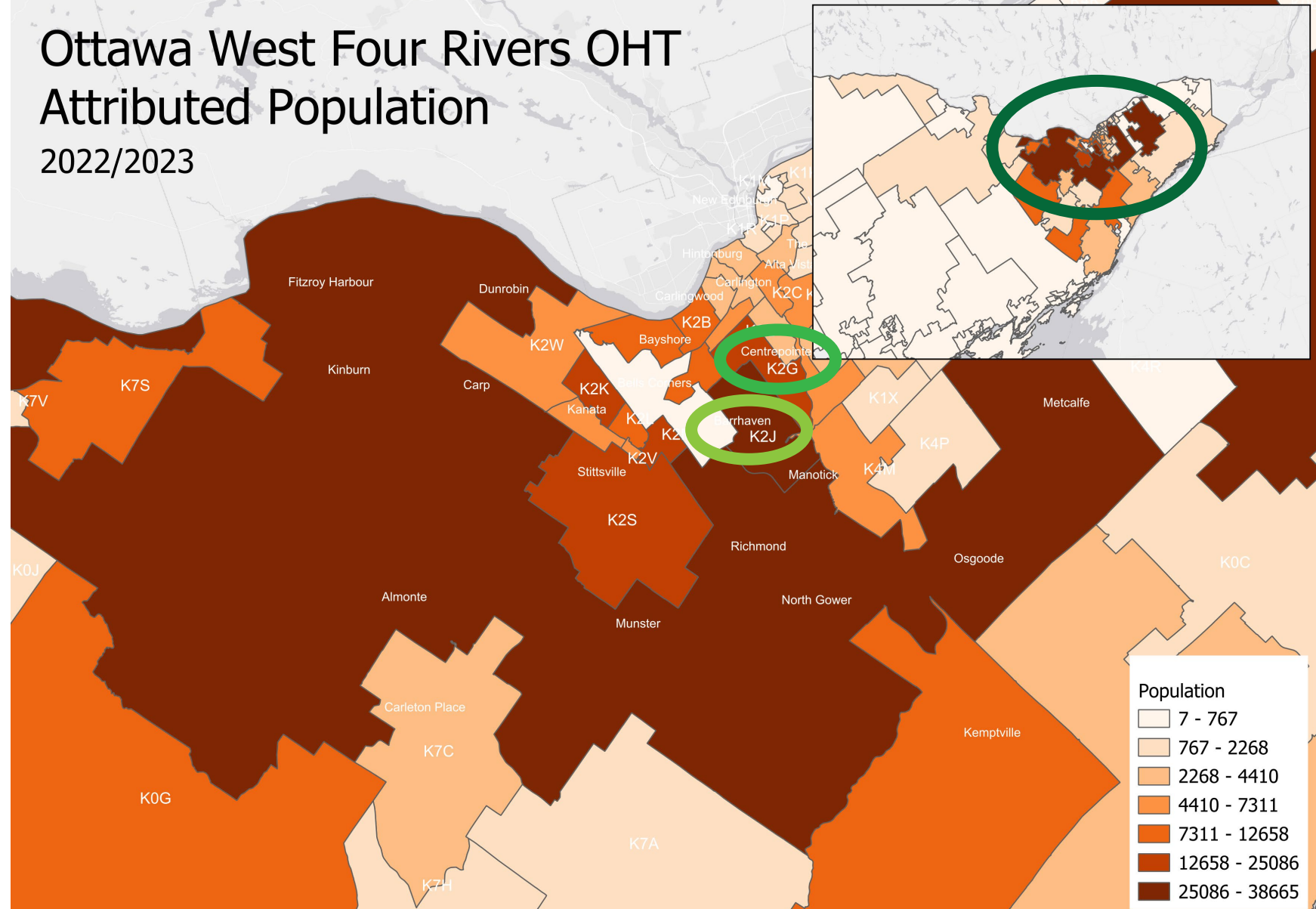

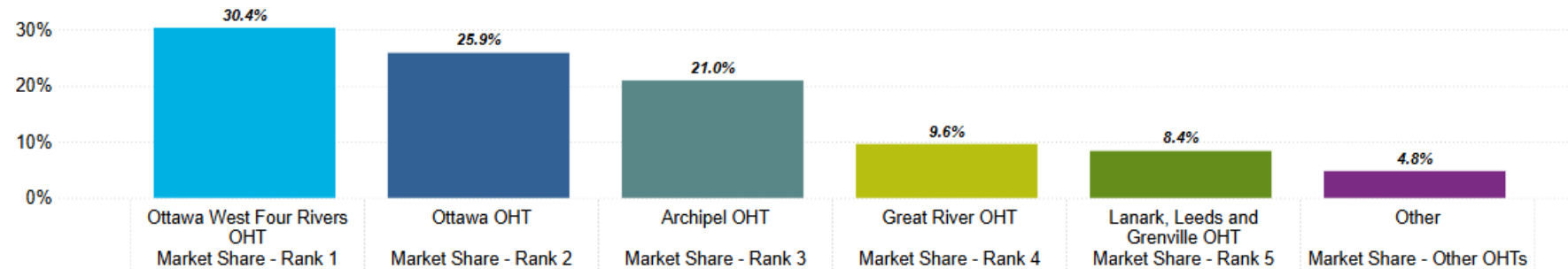

OHT ROLE

BACKBONE OHT TEAM

- Convene partners for collaborative development, including across OHTs
- Ensure information and resources are available consistently to all partners
- Ensure broad, fair and transparent engagement and support

COLLABORATIVE LEADERSHIP COMMITTEE & PRIMARY CARE EXECUTIVE

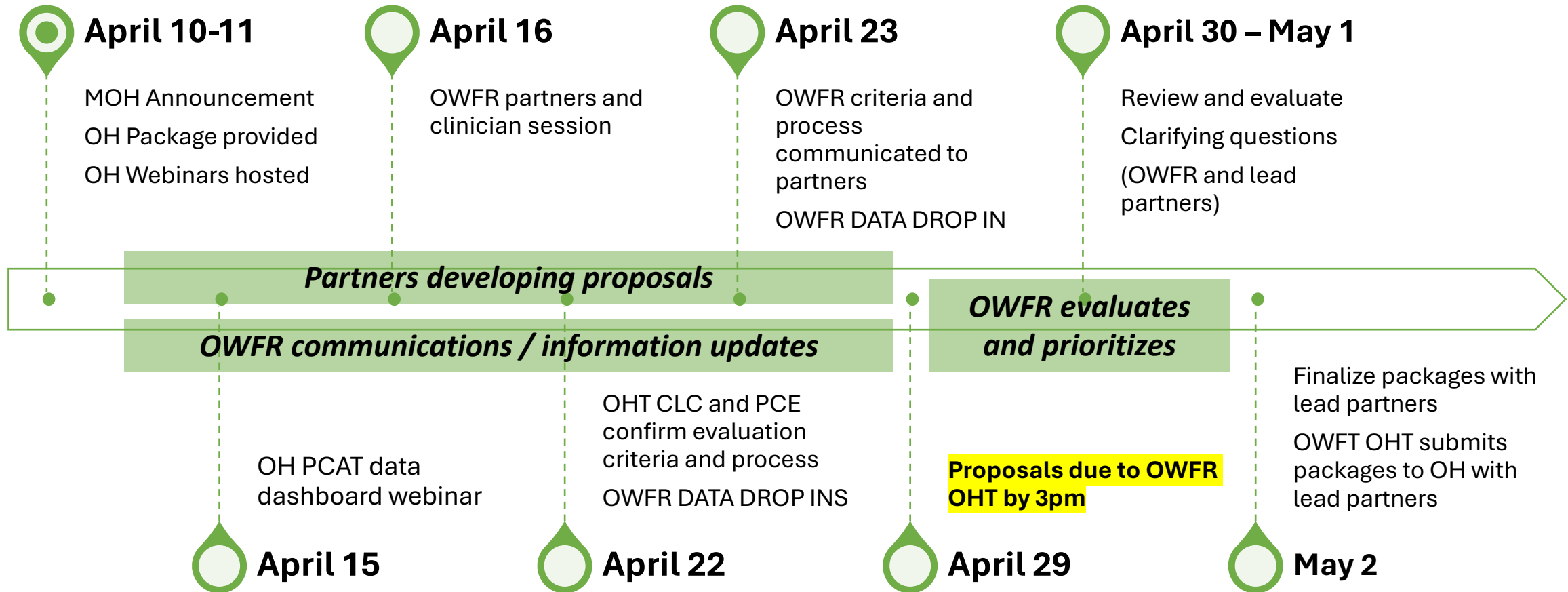
OHT ROLE

- Review and support 3 proposals for submission (one per FSA) using Collaborative Decision-Making Arrangement (CDMA) and consensus decision-making model
- Establish and communicate local OHT proposal evaluation criteria
- Identify evaluation panel following review of conflict-of-interest declarations (actual, potential, or perceived)
- Exercise care and diligence as reasonably expected
- Sign and submit (1) OHT attestation form along with the 3 supported proposals by May 2nd at 5:00pm

PARTNER ROLES

- Work with OHT / PCN to identify opportunities to collaborate with other primary care practices and clinicians
- Involve community partners
- Lead proposal development
- Write proposal content
- Determine budget for proposal
- Submit complete proposal package to OHT
